Good Afternoon, Local 3937:

Last week, I wrote about the University's planned closure of the University of Minnesota Child Development Center (UMCDC). That night, President Kaler made a phone call where he said, "he decided to postpone the closing of the CDC," with the official announcement going out the next day. So, this week, I'm writing to say... this announcement was only the beginning and we still have a lot of work to do.

Essentially, very little has changed. The University and President Kaler still plan to close the

UMCDC. They still plan to replace our highly skilled teaching staff with more cost friendly, and lower skilled workers. Even the timeline may not have changed, as the main push behind the closure was a whole other project that they still want to complete in the same timeframe.

So, while we're on the right track, we need to make sure we stay on it. That means we move forward like nothing has changed. We continue to stand together. We continue drawing that line in the sand, that says, we refuse to let this closure set a precedent and model that the University can use to take away all of our jobs. We continue telling the University that they cannot replace us with lower skilled workers just to cut costs. And we continue standing behind the UMCDC... because the next announcement still might be about us.
